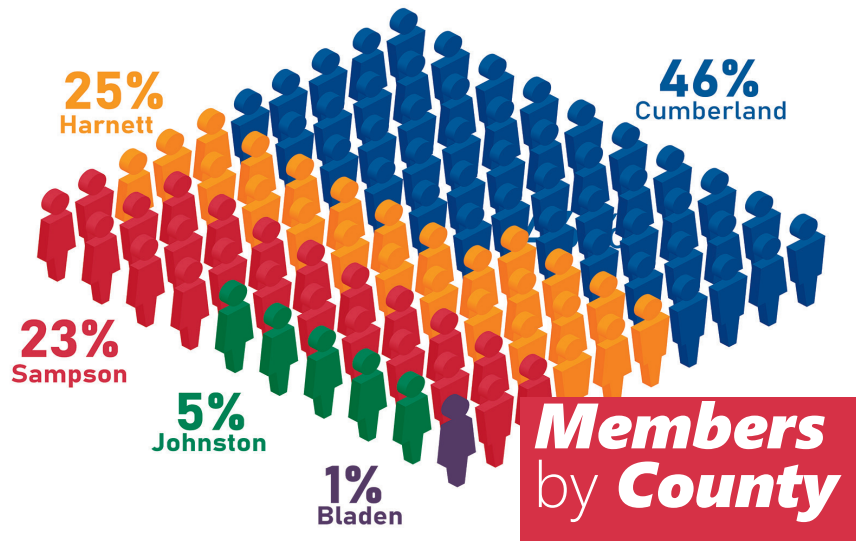
High Satisfaction Scores

9.2

South River EMC members rate their satisfaction with our Cooperative a 9.2 out of 10. We survey members quarterly to stay abreast of member attitudes and preferences.

System Reliability

South River EMC has a SAIDI (reliability index) of 44.91 and an ASAI (availability of power) of 99.997. This means that members experienced few outages of any significant duration for 2023.

We send students to Washington, D.C., basketball and baseball camps, reward good grades and offer scholarships.

Operation Round Up has funded over \$3.1 million in community programs, through voluntary member contributions.



Education
